Huntsville High School runners ready for season

Lehman hopes this group will stick together. "I'm really excited even though we have a young group, because I think we can accomplish a lot in the next few years."

On boys' side, it is the other way around--only a couple of varsity runners were lost from last year's team. Lehman has great expectations for this seasoned group, especially seniors Evan del Rio and Marquell Williams and juniors Oscar Benitez, Wyatt Pavelka, and George Thuita.

"Hopefully the team will make it out of the district to regionals this year," she said. "Even if the team doesn't, I hope to have as many as three runners make it to the state meet."

Last Friday was supposed to have been their first meet, but it was cancelled. The team will first compete this weekend at Moonlight Madness in Montgomery, and will continue to compete every weekend thereafter, until the District Meet in Willis on Oct. 12.

With long-time rivals Willis, Magnolia, and Magnolia West, it's a tough district. Lehman expects our district will have "lots of people represented at state."

Nonetheless, she is excited for the season to begin. "I'm ready. I really want to see what Evan can do this year. He is college-bound, so he really has some goals set. Marquell has some goals set. Two track girls, Lillie Burnett and MaRae Kendrick, are running with us, and we want to find them a college home too.

"Honestly that's what it's all about for me, helping these kids get into college and get support for college." But a district title would be nice as well!
